Selection Criteria:

- 1) Applicants must be graduating high school seniors or current undergraduate or graduate students who will be attending college full-time in the Fall 2022 Spring 2023 school year.
- 2) Applicants must have at least a 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale
- 3) Applicants must be a HUMC member for at least one year prior to the application date.
- 4) Applicants must be attending college for seminary, Christian educator, minister of music, deacon, or public or community service professions, including the teaching or other public service professions.
- 5) Scholarship awardees of prior years are not eligible for an award.
- 6) Applicants must demonstrate participation in leadership activities, extracurricular activities, church service, and community or work experience.
- 7) The merit-based award will be based on a combination of the above factors. Applicants will not be subject to discrimination on the basis of sex, race, creed, national origin, or disability.
