First Lesson Psalm 137:1-6 Damon Moore

Psalm 137 is a song of grief. It recalls the lonely and desolate lives of the Israelites while in captivity in Babylon. The people longed for their native land and longed for God to remember the wrongs done to Jerusalem when it was destroyed. So deep was their sorrow they could neither play their harps nor sing their songs of praise.

- ¹ By the rivers of Babylon we sat and wept when we remembered Zion.
- ² There on the poplars we hung our harps,
- ³ for there our captors asked us for songs, our tormentors demanded songs of joy; they said, "Sing us one of the songs of Zion!"
- ⁴ How can we sing the songs of the Lord while in a foreign land?
- ⁵ If I forget you, Jerusalem, may my right hand forget its skill.
- ⁶ May my tongue cling to the roof of my mouth if I do not remember you.

Second Lesson John 11:23-35 Damon Moore

The story of the raising of Lazarus is the sixth of seven signs John gives to prove that Jesus is the Messiah, the Christ, Son of God, and that through faith in him believers receive eternal life. Even as the event shows Jesus' divine power over death itself, it also shows him as a wonderfully sensitive human being. His love for Lazarus is clear. Martha's and Mary's accusation that Jesus' presence would have averted Lazarus' death tells how real their friendship was. So also did Jesus' tears. The story is John's reflection on the significance of the resurrection. Because Jesus is fully human and fully divine, life and death are his gifts to give.

²³ Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise again." ²⁴ Martha said to him, "I know that he will rise again in the resurrection on the last day." ²⁵ Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, ²⁶ and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" ²⁷ She said to him, "Yes, Lord, I believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one coming into the world."

Jesus Weeps

²⁸ When she had said this, she went back and called her sister Mary and told her privately, "The Teacher is here and is calling for you." ²⁹ And when she heard it, she got up quickly and went to him. ³⁰ Now Jesus had not yet come to the village but was still at the place where Martha had met him. ³¹ The Jews who were with her in the house consoling her saw Mary get up quickly and go out. They followed her because they thought that she was going to the tomb to weep there. ³² When Mary came where Jesus was and saw him, she knelt at his feet and said to him, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." ³³ When Jesus saw her weeping and the Jews who came with her also weeping, he was greatly disturbed in spirit and deeply moved. ³⁴ He said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to him, "Lord, come and see." ³⁵ Jesus began to weep.
